



SCREENING CRITERIA

Our cabins are dormitory style. Bunk beds are approximately 4 feet apart from each other. Personal belongings, such as clothing are usually stored in the Campers suitcase located under the individual's bed or on a shelf nearby.

Careful consideration should be given to Applicants who have the following characteristics, as they may NOT be good candidates for this summer camp program:

Cabin Life:

- Applicants who have difficulty sleeping in a large room with approximately 8 -16 individuals
- Applicants who might be disruptive to others while trying to sleep

General Attitude:

- Applicants who will take or abuse other's personal belongings
- Applicants who have a history of starting fires or are abusive to property
- Applicants who require continuous time-outs and /or confinement
- Applicants who are physically or verbally abusive and are a danger to others
- Applicants who are unable or are unwilling to participate in planned camp activities (see application form)

Personal Care:

- Applicants who require more assistance than a volunteer can provide (e.g. incontinence)
- Applicants who require "transfer assistance" from wheelchair or other mechanical devices

Dietary Considerations:

- Food is prepared based on the Canada Food Guide. Due to the number of individuals participating at camp, special dietary needs are not included in the planning and preparation of daily menus
- Unique dietary requirements of individuals must be disclosed in the Camp Application form. Conditional acceptance of individuals with special/unique dietary needs will be determined by the Camp Committee. Special consideration may be given to individuals who can provide their own prepackaged, ready to heat meals

ATTENDANCE CRITERIA

Youth Week

- Applicants should be between the ages of 8 and 18 years of age

Adult Weeks

- Applicants should be 19 years and older

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Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- **Between the ages of 18 - 45**
- Follow instructions
- Meet dorm environment
- Care for own belongings
- Independent of personal care
- Communicate and interact well with others
- Function with minimal supervision (campers are placed in a 3:1 ratio with volunteers)

Applicants will be accepted on the basis of:

- Fully completed Application Form (3 Parts)
- Accompaniment of Registration Fees
- Past Camp attendance records
- Volunteer availability
- Available spaces

Camper Application Form needs to be returned to Rehoboth by March 1, 2009. Registration fee, Participation Agreement and Medical Form must accompany the Application Form in order to be processed. The Rehoboth Camp Committee will complete the intake process on March 15, 2008. Successful Applicants will receive confirmation letter by April 11, 2008

REFUND POLICY

Refunds (less \$25 for Administration Services) will be issued before camp:

- a) To individuals who must cancel due to illness that is substantiated by a medical note from their physician.
- b) To individuals who cancel for any reason 45 days prior to the first day of the scheduled camp.

Refunds will **NOT** be issued for individuals who are returned home during camp due to:

- a) Inappropriate behavior
- b) Disruptive behavior affecting other campers including verbal abuse/outbursts
- c) Physical abuse
- d) Abuse to others' personal belonging
- e) Destruction of property
- f) Illness
